**127-135 Sacramento Street**

- 1858** – Lafayette Hall was here owned by Frenchman Pierre and Madame Hoin. They were known for serving local wines.
- 1870** – Irishman Stephen Dwyer, his wife Kate and their seven children, lived over their grocery store here.
- 1900** – Stephen Dwyer sold to J. E. Walsh.
- 1905** – Joseph Hines bought the property and put in his blacksmith shop.
- 1922** – Joseph Hines converted his blacksmith shop into a garage for automobiles.
- 1925** – Joseph Hines put up this new building on this site.
- 1931** – Hines sold the property to George and Tomo Tsuda. This was the site of their first grocery store in Old Town.
- 1942** – The Tsudas and other people of Japanese heritage all along the West Coast were placed in internment camps at the outbreak of World War II. The Tsudas were forced to close their shop.
- 1993** – Serendipity Antiques moved into the building.
