



337 Commercial Street

- 1852 – George McRitchie had the Star Bakery on this lot.**
- 1855 – After the Big Fire, John C. Baker owned the Bakery and quickly erected this brick building. The building and Star Bakery was soon owned by Miles Furniss.**
- 1866 – Miles Furniss sold the building to Mack Webber who in the same year sold it to Ed Walsh, the first mayor of Auburn. Ed was a tailor.**
- 1873 – V. V. Mann had his undertaking business here. He was also a furniture maker.**
- 1885 – Jack Morris had his dry good store here.**
- 1889 – There was a brick addition to the building, it added the second story.**
- 1893– Gould Coker and W. A. Crowell had an undertaking and embalming business here.**
- 1896 – Ed Walsh was now a notary and insurance agent with his office here.**
- 1905 – Ed Walsh still owned the building**
- 1951 – The *Placer Herald* newspaper was here.**
