



343 - 345 Commercial Street

- 1849 - This was the site of 49er Charles Reed's log store.**
- 1852 - James and William Parkinson owned the building and had a grocery store here.**
- 1855 - The Big Fire destroyed the building that was here but this new brick one was up in three months. There were two store fronts here.**
- 1857 - John Boggs had an oyster saloon in part of the building and William Parkinson was still selling groceries in the other part.**
- 1860 - Charles Higgins and James McBurney occupied both stores as the Magnolia Saloon.**
- 1865 - The building was sold to the local militia, the Auburn Grays. They used it as their armory.**
- 1871 - The Auburn Grays sold the building to Jacob Neff, the same year Neff sold the building to Julia Lubeck. The next year she sold it to James Hale, an attorney.**
- 1887 - F. D. Adams, D. W. Lubeck, A. Huntley and J. H. Neff organized the Placer County Bank.**
- 1888 - This building was remodeled to house the Placer County Bank.**
- 1904 - Adolph Weber, later convicted murderer, robbed the bank here.**
- 1918 - Placer County Bank closed this branch.**
