- 1851 – Amos Gove had a dry goods store here.**
- 1855 – The great fire burned out Gove and his partner Charles Eberly.**
- 1855 – Gove and Eberly and John Van Mater along with the Davidson brothers with their partner Samuel Marks cleared this property and put up these brick buildings.**
- 1859 – Amos Gove and his new partner Alex Gordon had a grocery/hardware/provisions store here.**
- 1862 – Thomas Stephens took over the store.**
- 1870s – This building often held two different businesses. At one time they included a tin shop and a dry goods store.**
- 1890s – There was a tin shop here and a saddle shop.**
- 1906 – Thomas James, the saloon owner and restaurateur, bought the entire block. He rented out all the buildings until the 1940s when he sold it.**
- 1919 – Charley Kee took over the restaurant that was here.**
