- 1859 – W. F. Brittain and William Hardy built a brick building here after the fire that destroyed fifty-eight buildings.**
- 1861 – Anton and Eliza Adrian opened their Deutches Gasthaus Restaurant here.**
- 1875 – Eliza and her daughter ran the restaurant, now called the Auburn Restaurant, after Anton died.**
- 1890 – Eliza Adrian sold the building to Fred Brye for his butcher shop.**
- 1904 – Fred Brye sold the butcher shop and building to the William and Ella Waddle family.**
- 1911 – After William died, Ella and her sons ran the butcher shop.**
- 1932 – A fire burned down the butcher shop.**
- 1939 – Shizuo Kato hired Greeley Herrington to build a new building for his Auburn Fish Market.**
- 1942 – The Kato family and many others of Japanese heritage on the West Coast were sent to internment camps during World War II.**
- 1961 – Minnie's used clothing and furniture store.**
- 1963 – Grandma's Attic Antique store.**
- 1983 – Sierra Moon Goldsmith store opened.**
