

# Stars and Stripes.

## 215 Maple Street

- 1854 – Printing office of the *Whig* newspaper.
- 1855 – The building here burned in the Great Fire but was rebuilt quickly. It was the printing office of the *Placer Press* newspaper.
- 1861 – Printing office of the *Democratic Signal* newspaper.
- 1862 – Printing office of the *Union Advocate* newspaper.
- 1863 – Printing office of the *Stars and Stripes* newspaper.
- 1866 – Sheriff John Boggs, who owned the *Stars and Stripes* newspaper, filed a claim for the Auburn Stars and Stripes Gold Ledge and worked the claim right here.
- 1873 – The building became a residence.
- 1900 – The building was demolished and this current one was erected by David Michael Lininger, a local contractor, for Caroline Keehner. Caroline was the widow of bakery and saloon owner, George Keehner.
- 1910 – Caroline's daughter, Rose Walsh, lived here for many years with her family.
- 1941 – The house was purchased by Placer County and used for several county departments over the years.
- 1970s – The house came back into private hands.
